CIDT offers special perspectives on skating styles and techniques. These sessions will enhance your ability to work in different styles, respond with a background of experience to various choreographers and move toward developing a distinctive style of your own. The workshops on October 24th, November 21st and December 19th will be led by various creative skating personalities. Sessions include both on-ice and off-ice training.

October Workshop with Gary Beacom

Theme: Skating Outside The Box

Description: A master performer shows you the how and why he is in demand for shows and workshops around the world and what you can learn from him.



About the instructor:

Gary Beacom is world famous for his highly innovative style. He was an Olympic Team member for Canada in 1984, World Professional Champion and U.S. Open Champion in 1988 and has performed professionally all over the world beginning with The Torvill and Dean World Tour 1985-86. In 2007 he toured Russia with Evgeny Plushenko in Stradivarius On Ice and he regularly performs in Canada Ice Dance Theatre Productions, including the annual "Story-Telling-On-Ice" for school children. His being a great advertisement for male figure skating, young boys and girls find his speed and daring exciting.

Gary's television credits include: "Adrienne Clarkson Presents", "A Life On The Edge" in 1992, and he has choreographed programs for Kurt Browning, and Olympic Champions Jamie Sale' and David Pelletier. He has authored books on his exceptional life path and on the technique of figure skating.

Gary now coaches at the Racquet Club of Victoria while maintaining his performance and workshop activities world-wide.

November Workshop with Moira North

Theme: Polishing Your Performance

Description: Using techniques employed to develop the Company of The Ice Theatre of New York, its Artistic Director shows you how she achieves a clean and sophisticated style.



About the instructor:

Moira North is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Ice Theatre of New York where she has been highly effective in establishing a company that has gained the respect of the City's dance critics and brought invitations to her company to perform in Europe, on Television and in various New York and other U.S. venues. The Company has received funding from The National Endowment for the Arts, The New York State Council for the Arts and The New York City Department of Cultural Affairs.

With partner Patrick Dean, Moira was World Professional Ice Dancing Champion in 1984. Besides her work as Artistic Director of ITNY, she was called upon to choreograph for the film "The Preacher's Wife", with Whitney Houston and Denzel Washington and was Creative Consultant for "Winter Solstice On Ice" for the Arts and Entertainment Channel.

In 1998 and 2003 Moira North was honoured with the designation, "One of the 25 Most Influential Names in Skating" by International Figure Skating Magazine for being the driving force for figure skating as a performing art.

Moira North has given workshops for CIDT in 2008, has participated in an exchange of performers, and continues to act as an Advisor to CIDT.

December Workshop with Ron Vincent

Theme: Making Your Performance Exciting

Description: To create more exciting performances, CIDT's Artistic Director takes you through elements of movement that you can apply, and keep your audience watching!

About the instructor:

Mr Vincent co-founded Canada Ice Dance Theatre (CIDT) in 1976 and continues as Artistic Director. He has choreographed, directed and produced over seventy-five semi-professional and professional ice shows for Clubs, Corporations and CIDT. A singular honour was a nomination for "Best Entertainment at an Event in North America in 1995" for the Amway Japan Show at BC Place Stadium, in collaboration with producer Mark Wyatt.

Highlights of his competitive career include being a member of the Senior Canadian Team at the 1949 North American Championships with ice dance partner Joy Forsyth. He was also the Junior Pairs Champion of Canada that same year. He trained at the Toronto Skating Club.

Ron has been the Head Coach at top skating clubs across the country. He has been instrumental in the development and the education of Canadian coaches having held the positions of President of The Figure Skating Coaches of Canada (1978-1979), Director of Education and Coaching Program Director of the NCCP for Figure Skating Coaches. Mr. Vincent has conducted numerous independent skating workshops and has taught at national and provincial level seminars.

Mr. Vincent's recent projects includes his adaptation of Robert Munsch stories for CIDT's Story-Telling-On-Ice program. His choreography and direction of these stories have been seen by thousands of children in BC. Most recently he choreographed the culturally thoughtful "Colours" for CIDT's 2009 spring production of "Mosaic".

Ron Vincent received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the BC Section of Skate Canada in 1997 and today continues to follow the mandate of Canada Ice Dance Theatre, the pursuit of figure skating as a serious performing art. He points out that theatrical skating requires the same strong technique as competitive skating but with a greater emphasis on artistry within the context of art and entertainment.
