

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - HILARY QUICK



As we reflect on the last season, I would say this year we celebrated the return to "regularly scheduled programming" and embraced the change that was all around us. As we went through the year so many wonderful things happened, and the biggest, people returned to the rink, IN RECORD NUMBERS!

Nationally, Skate Canada hit, for the first time since the early 90's more than 200,000 members! Here in British Columbia/ Yukon we saw a growth of 3222 members, which is 16% more than last year.

What a great problem to have! I know I don't need to tell any club board member this, wait lists have now become the norm and our current question, how do we get more ice, how do we get more coaches? How do we support our clubs as they navigate this?

One answer we have to this is a major initiative coming next season to support the program delivery of CanSkate across the section. We will be hosting CanSkate workshops in the four outlying regions this year. Having strong CanSkate programming is key to

ensuring our skaters have the best experience possible when they come to the rink. Whether they want to skate for fun, skate to win, we just want them to have the best experience possible.

This year we introduced a new competition calendar that began April 2023. In alignment with the Skate Canada Long Term Development Plan, things will look different. We ask everyone to come with an open mind, as we know change can be challenging. But we believe that at the end of the day, this new structure, is athlete development centered. We also saw the addition of new National events, a separate Challenge for Pre-Novice and Novice athletes and the introduction of the National Novice event and the Canada Cup. It was busy but so great to see athletes compete at the right time developmentally for them.

Synchronized Skating was in the spotlight this season with Junior and Senior teams competing at the Skate Canada National Championships along with the four other disciplines. It was amazing to see the energy and excitement this discipline brought to the event, and I believe that this exposure will see the growth of Synchro. The section also has been working hard to help support our Synchronized skating coaches and teams. Pascal Denis, coach of two-time world champions Les Supremes, lent his expertise to the teams this fall, and we are thankful that he will be returning several times next year to continue this development.

Competitions, Seminars, and Assessment Days were back in full swing this season. The ability to connect in person was felt throughout the year and we are so grateful to experience the volunteers, coaches, officials, and athletes doing what they do best, in person, together again.

Thank you for joining us as we mark another successful season, connect with each other and learn together.

Podium Pathway

The Quick Reference Guides for Singles, Pairs and Dance for the 2023-2024 season are posted on the Technical Page of the website. In addition to the usual short program group changes, there is a small change to the Juvenile Well Balanced Program Requirements and a change to the solo spin in the Pre-Novice Men's Short Program, which will always be a change camel spin going forward. As noted in this report last year, to align with LTD and the Athlete Development Matrices (ADM), the BC/YT Section will no longer include the Pre-Juvenile category in competitions. These skaters are well served in

the STAR categories and may transition to Podium Pathway categories when ready.

• STARSkate

This past season there were no significant changes to the STAR competition requirements and at the time of writing, the same is true for the 2023-2024 season. Any changes will be communicated and posted on the Skating in BC website as soon as they are published by Skate Canada.

New Qualifying Calendar

2022-2023 saw a new qualifying event calendar for Pre-Novice to Senior in the disciplines of singles, pairs, ice dance and synchronized skating. Challenge was split into Junior/Senior and Pre-Novice/Novice. The National Championships for junior and senior categories included synchronized skating for the first time. This addition was a huge (and loud!) hit. BC was represented in the Junior category by the Lower Mainland Synchronized Skating team who placed 7th. Novice skaters in singles, pairs and ice dance had their own national championships in February along with the Skate Canada Cup for synchronized skating which included Novice, Intermediate and Open categories. A review of this structure will take place at the end of the 2023-2024 season.

To support the new national competition structure, the BC/YT Section has reorganized its competition calendar and event offerings. Look for a new June Competition for the Podium Pathway stream and a September competition to replace the April event. This new competition is designed to give skaters additional competition mileage prior to the Sectional Championships. STAR Skate Final in March is also being revamped to be a season ending event for both Podium Pathway and STAR Skate streams.

StarSkate skaters, many of whom who have never had an opportunity to experience the Kelowna Camp due to COVID the past few years, attended the three day camp this past Easter weekend. The Kootenay Region has had a great season. Everyone was excited to return to a more "normal" skating season. The energy in the stands at live events was palpable and a much-needed boost to the skating community.

Most of our clubs have lost ice at this point or by the end of this week. Clubs are combining on ice that is still available to have spring schools and those same areas should have ice by mid to late August to start their summer schools. The smaller communities will have ice by mid to late September to resume the 2023/2024 season. At this point we only have 10 actively running clubs in our region.

This past season the Kootenay Region was host to three competitions and a Learn to Train seminar. Our Learn to train seminar was held in Creston BC with Kaetlyn Osmund facilitating. We had a strong showing of skaters at the seminar in the STAR 2,3,4 categories but skater numbers in levels above STAR 4 have dwindled so we have to cater to the lower levels with hopes of rebuilding the upper levels to previous numbers. Our West Kootenay

Invitation competition held the second weekend in December was a live skater virtual judging event. The format works well for the West Kootenay Invitational as flights are notoriously unreliable so without local judging and data staff for the event we are always at the mercy of the weather. The goal for this season will be to increase the number of participants in the West Kootenay event as its numbers were low again this season. The East Kootenay Invitational was a large event for our region and was hosted in Fernie BC. The proximity of the East Kootenay to the Alberta region allows that competition to draw from a larger pool of skaters and it drives the numbers way up making the event a busy weekend with a greater mix of skaters to increase competition opportunities in events. Our Kootenay Region Executive pulled off an excellent Kootenay Regional Championships in Creston BC. It was amazing to see the level of participation especially in our team spirit showcase and the stands were full of spectators.

The Kootenay Region is in a good financial position heading into the 2023/2024 season. We thank Jill Sibbald for her continued dedication to maintaining our financial needs and ensuring we stay in a positive position to offer our seminar.

The Kootenay Regions biggest challenge is securing coaching staff for our communities. Many clubs are struggling and have been struggling to find a certified coach for their club. This constant need to look for coaching is causing volunteer burnout and a decrease in operating clubs. Unfortunately, with our shorter skating seasons clubs are not able to offer lucrative year-round opportunities for employment to coaches and as such find it very hard to find anyone. It has caused a decline in skaters staying in the sport. Smaller communities in our region compete with many sports and few participants in their coaching your program fails. This is a constant battle for clubs in our region. We currently have 5 clubs hoping to secure a coach for the 2023/2024 season it will be a lofty goal and the region is attempting to support the volunteers in their quest to secure coaching.

Looking ahead to next season the Kootenay Region is planning to host its learn to Train seminar the first part of October next season. A facilitator has not yet been chosen. The West Kootenay Invitational is currently looking for ice but will be held the second weekend in December again. The East Kootenay Invitational will be held in Invermere BC, and the Kootenay Regional Championships will be held in Creston BC.
