ACCREDITATION FOR QUALIFYING EVENTS

Provincial Coaches are eligible to attend qualifying events with Pre-Novice skaters or teams.

Provincial Coach Home Study Guide

Attend the following Provincial Coach Courses and complete the corresponding workbooks

- Stroking and Skating Skills

Includes the following components:

Video Lessons

- One technical video lesson with lesson plan
- One stroking or skating skill video lesson with lesson plan

Video analysis and music file of a skater whose program you choreographed

Please note that all video lessons and analysis requirements are using a skater or team at the Pre-Novice level.

A certified status is achieved upon successful completion of the Provincial Coach Certified Portfolio. Maintenance of Certification will apply with a certified status (12 points/ 3-year cycle)

Provincial Coach (TO BE REVISED)

The Provincial Coach Program (formerly Intermediate STARSkate/Provincial Coach — ISPC) gives coaches a taste of coaching all skating disciplines. Focusing on the Learn to Compete stage of LTAD coaches dive deeper into the importance of yearly planning and athlete management. The coach pathway is represented below. This NCCP context is next to be revised by Skate Canada.

Pre-Requisites

- Regional Coach Certified status
- Must be either a registered Skate Canada coach in good standing or a Skate Canada registrant

In-training Status

- Complete the Provincial Coach Home Study Guide
- Attend the Sport Science Course and complete the required workbook
- Attend the Stroking and Skating Skills course and complete the required workbook

Trained Status

- Attend the Singles course and complete the required workbook
- Attend the Dance course and complete the required workbook
- Attend the Pairs and Synchronized skating course and complete the required workbooks

Coaches must attend and complete all discipline courses and required workbooks to earn a Trained status. Please note that courses are not recorded in the Locker until the workbooks are completed. As we transition this program, coaches who have completed the Sport Science and Stroking and Skating Skills requirements (course and workbook) will be granted an In-training status. Coaches who have completed all discipline courses and workbooks will earn a Trained status.

Certified Status

• Must be a registered Skate Canada coach, in good standing



- Successfully complete the Provincial Coach Certified Evaluation Portfolio which includes:
 - o Submission of a technical lesson at the pre-novice level
 - o Submission of a stroking lesson or skating skills lesson at the pre-novice level
 - o Submission of a video analysis and music CD of a pre-novice skater/team whose program you have designed or choreographed
