



The CKPG-TV News team produced an astonishing <u>News Coverage</u> on the Youth DanceSport Latin classes and Youth DanceSport Special classes designed for Figure Skaters and dance students. These classes were a crucial part of the <u>Prince George Ballroom / DanceSport Workshop</u> held at the John McInnis Centre in Prince George on Friday May 31st through Sunday June 2nd.

As important as Ballet, <u>Ballet-Jazz</u> and <u>Martha Graham technique</u> were for my competitive skating development, I also discovered (when my Ice Dance Partner & myself took Ballroom classes in Toronto) that <u>DanceSport Latin</u> dancing offers an important extra dimension in body movement / expression to the core dance disciplines I was trained in. It was from watching <u>Yuliya Zavadska</u> & <u>Sharon Levit</u> as they were training for their DanceSport competitions that helped me learn the proper technique in Latin dancing and expression. I was also very impressed with Yuliya's teaching / coaching of her competitive dancers as they trained for their competitions. Yuliya, herself, has also expanded her dance training beyond DanceSport as can be seen in her performances in <u>So You Think You Can Dance Canada (season 4)</u> where, for example, she integrates Jazz moves into her routine "<u>You Give Me Fever</u>". There isn't time to teach this basic technique during the skating lessons; it's best done in off-ice classes. When the skater has been trained in Latin Dancing fundamentals then we can focus on the adaptation of that technique during on-ice lesson time. It's been my ambition to give the skaters of this generation the same opportunity that I have received; having the local skaters exposed to Latin Dancing and expression under Yuliya's instruction in this Workshop has accomplished that.

The Workshop also included classes for Adults and, as the organizer / administrator for this event; it was extremely rewarding to see how appreciative they were in having the opportunity to receive Yuliya's instructions. Maizie Bernard (dance teacher at the Prince George SS) invited Yuliya as a guest teacher for her dance classes at the school. It was rewarding to see the joy on the children's faces as they, within one hour, learned the basic Cha-Cha steps.

2013 WORLD TEAM TROPHY

The **2013 ISU World Team Trophy** is an international team figure skating competition in the 2012–2013 season. Participating countries selected two men's single skaters, two ladies' single skaters, one pair and one ice dancing entry to compete in a team format with points based on the skaters' placement.



Six countries qualified for the event: Canada (7824 points), the United States (7156), Japan (6820), Preside (6640), France (4826), and Chi

(6823), Russia (6648), France (4826), and China (4702).

The biggest movement for the Canadian team came from Kevin Reynolds who impressed by jumping from ninth place after the short to finish second in the freeskate giving him a 3rd place finish in the Men's event. "I was very relieved the close out the season with a strong performance," Reynolds said. "I was able to fight back and believe in myself and my training."

Kevin's strong finish earned the Canadian Team 10 points which was a huge contribution to Canada's 2nd place finish in the event. At the conclusion of the Men's event team Leader Patrick Chan remarked "Kevin really made the difference for us and helped us make up ground from day one."



Susan's Gems

SOME "THOUGHTS" FROM WORLDS

As you may or may not be aware I refereed the Ladies event at the World Championships in London Ontario. I would like to share two thoughts from the competition.

#1. Choreo Sequences-----for the Ladies

This is an element that should be given attention and fully developed as it is "free marks".

Make sure the sequence is WELL choreographed TO THE MUSIC. This is extremely important allowing the judge to give +2's and + 3's.

Cover the ice FULLY----this is good for the Technical Team in identifying the element and for plus GOEs.

Make sure each movement that you incorporate into the sequence is well defined with good quality of movement... 'poor quality of movements' can result in a GOE reduction of -1 to -2

Although different, I believe that much of the above applies to the Men's Choreo Sequence.

#2. Medical "Time-Outs"

I was very aware that a number of coaches did not realize that Carolina Kostner could have come over to me and received a three minute medical time-out for her nose bleed with NO DEDUCTION. (Rule #551 in the ISU Rulebook, page 108). There previously was a deduction but that is no longer the case.

Just thought I would pass these thoughts along to the Coaches.

ACCREDITATION FOR EVENTS POLICY REMINDER

As Skate Canada moves forward with the competitive re-structure, the Accreditation for Events Policy will also be undergoing a few changes. Several changes in the Accreditation for Events Policy will impact coaches.

Pre-juvenile sectional events: As of July 1, 2011, all coaches attending pre-juvenile events at a sectional event must be Intermediate STARSkate / Provincial Coach (IS/PC) certified.

Canadian Championships: As of July 1, 2012, all coaches attending this event will be required to be NCCP Level 3 certified. This means that coaches of Novice, Junior and Senior level competitors will have to meet this standard prior to Canadians in January 2013.

Canadian Synchronized Skating Championships: As of July 1, 2013, all coaches attending this event must be NCCP Level 3 certified. This means that coaches of Novice, Intermediate, Junior, Senior or Open teams must be NCCP Level 3 certified prior to the Synchronized Skating Championships in 2014.

We have communicated these changes with the Section Offices and have requested they assist where possible in providing the relevant NCCP technical courses. Please contact your local office for a list of courses in your area.

Please keep the above mentioned certification requirements in mind to ensure that you have achieved the necessary certification level to attend the events with your athletes. If you have any questions please contact coaching&programs@skatecanada.ca







What is the Feedback Service?

This is a program of the BC/YK Section's Skaters Development Committee established in conjunction with the new Super Series competitions. The program objectives are:

- To provide useful and accurate feedback to skaters in the competitive stream and their coaches.
- To raise awareness among skaters, coaches and parents of the criteria for assessment by Technical and Judging Panels.

To develop a cadre of technical specialists, controllers, referees and judges who can provide useful feedback to skaters and their coaches in a timely, accurate and appropriate way.

How Does it work?

Skaters or coaches make their request to have feedback on their scores and performances at the competition through the Section office. For each program requested, there are three different assessments:

- <u>Technical Calls Assessment:</u> Levels of Difficulty of elements called by the Technical Panel (e.g. lifts, step sequences, spins) as well as details about other aspects of the technical scores such as downgraded jumps.
- <u>Technical GOE Assessment</u>: Grades of Execution or GOE's, which are the scores on each element awarded by the judges on the quality of the elements executed.
- <u>Program Components Assessments:</u> these are the five scores which deal with overall aspects of the performance: Skating Skills, Transitions and Linking Movements; Performance and Execution; Choreography and Composition; Interpretation.

The assessments are conducted after the competitions. The goal is to promote a common understanding and use of the actual criteria used in establishing the scores on the skater's report card. Sample assessments can be found on the Skating in BC website.

Who are the Assessors?

Assessors are drawn from the list of Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers, Referees and Judges of the BC/YK Section. They are assigned by the Judges' and Technical Committees with input from the Skaters' Development Committee. Working from the report card and video of the skater's performance, the assessor addresses each score with relation to the criteria for evaluation. The objective is to enrich the understanding of both coach and skater with regards to improvement for the future, within the established criteria.
