



# Justin Hampole Takes Home Bronze At Canada Winter Games

VANCOUVER – Prince George's own Justin Hampole earned a bronze medal at the Canada Winter Games..

he figure skater was second going into the day's competition after a personal best short program on Tuesday. After another clean program he earned a combined total of 91.88 points to place third.

"I never expected to win a medal," said Hampole.

"My goal was 90 points and I achieved that and I am so happy to have won bronze. It has been a great experience." "I have never been that nervous before a skate before. But, I have been talking with a

sport psychologist and he said that if you don't have nerves you don't care. I was really nervous so I guess I must really care."

Team BC won four medals overall. Beres Clements (Gibsons) skated a strong program and finished in fourth place overall.

For the pre-novice women, Olivia Gran of Kelowna skated a personal best in the short program and was in first place going into the free skate but struggled on her jumps in the

performance. She scored a total of 94.83, which was enough for the silver medal behind Sarah-Maude Blanchard of Quebec. Alisa Lyesina (Victoria) placed fifth.

In the Special Olympics Level 2 competition Matthew Lai (Richmond) earned gold and his teammate Eric Pahima

(Vancouver) earned silver.

### Stephanie Divín follows OLYMPIC LINEAGE



Stephanie Divín followed a family tradition when she took up figure skating. In 1960 the 15-year-old's paternal grandfather Karol Divín earned the silver medal at the Winter Olympics in Squaw Valley, California, competing for what was then Czechoslovakia. This week Stephanie won the bronze medal in the Special Olympics Singles Level II category at the 2015 Canada Winter Games in Prince George.

Team BC Special Olympics coach Jessica Chapelski said watching Stephanie receive her medal at Thursday's ceremony was a heart-warming and emotional experience.

"I cried when she received her medal," said Chapelski. "I think one of my favourite things about this experience is seeing her come out of her shell. She's really opened up and grown so much as a person this week." Normally a shy teenager, Stephanie blossomed and was very "witty" when she and her teammates enjoyed a few games of Monopoly in their hotel room, raved Chapelski. "This was a good platform for her to be more confident in herself," said

Chapelski.

Stephanie began figure skating 13 years ago and skates at the North Surrey Skating Club where she is coached by Tannis Marshall. The week before arriving in Prince George, Stephanie won the gold medal at the Special Olympics BC provincial championships in Kamloops. Chapelski said the young skater has a chance to compete for Team BC again in February 2016 at the Special Olympic Canadian national championship in Cornerbrook, Nfld. The team should be announced in the next couple of months. Karol Divín was introduced to figure skating by his father, who also coached him in his early years.

Divín competed in three Olympics – 1956, 1960 and 1964. He won the silver medal in 1960 and fourth in 1964. Divín was a two-time European champion and a Worlds medalist twice, silver in 1962 and bronze in 1964. Divín hung up his skates in 1964.

For Stephanie, her grandfather is an inspiration and a role model for her as she continues to advance in figure skating. There are six Special Olympics levels.

Level II and III athletes were competing at the 2015 Canada Winter Games.Karol Divín resides in the Czech Republic but visits his granddaughter every year when they talk about their mutual passion for skating, according to Stephanie's mom Outi Divin.

"We are proud of Stephanie following in Karol's footsteps," said Outi. "He gives her pointers when they talk."

"She was very happy all week," added Chapelski. "Very unflappable and when she stepped out onto the ice the energy of the crowd invigorated her performance."

Chapelski said Stephanie has hidden her bronze medal in a special place because the humble young woman doesn't like the attention she receives when she wears it around her neck.




### Certification Programs with LTAD

# CONTINUOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM (CEP) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AT ITS BEST

Being successful as a Skate Canada coach requires you to think carefully and strategically about your skills and objectives. It also requires you to consider the areas in which you need to either refine and/or develop. Whether you are coaching full-time or part-time, committing to personal and professional development is essential in helping our athletes reach their full potential. Participation in the CEP was mandatory this season and Skate Canada is so proud to share that over 5000 coaches had complied with this requirement in early September! Thank you all for your continued commitment towards professional development and the coaching profession.

In partnership with the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC), Skate Canada has aligned the Continuous Education Program (CEP) requirements with CAC's Maintenance of Certification policy. Skate Canada and CAC have streamlined the requirements needed to register as a Skate Canada coaching member and to also maintain an active NCCP certification status with CAC.

Aligning both programs required Skate Canada to modify the dates of the CEP cycles. Continuing on a two-year basis, the CEP cycles will now coincide with CAC's Maintenance of Certification policy effective January 1, 2015 for Skate Canada coaches.

To make this transition easy for coaches, we have extended the 2014-2016 CEP cycle to 30 months – July 1, 2014 to December 31, 2016. January 1, 2017 will be the date coaches obtain a renewed NCCP status with CAC, and obtain a CEP status (gold, silver, bronze, or compliant) should enough points be accumulated during the cycle as indicated on this chart.

In partnership with CAC, we will communicate the changes made to the point value per acceptable activities in an upcoming email campaign. In the meantime, Skate Canada is in the process of implementing a new database and designing a new CEP electronic form to accommodate the changes. We hope to have this tool available in 2015. As demonstrated this year, we encourage all of our coaches to continue professional development and to keep proof of the completed activities on file until further notice.

# EIGHT CANADIAN FIGURE SKATING COACHES WIN 2014 PETRO-CANADA COACHING EXCELLENCE AWARDS

After a remarkable season, eight Canadian figure skating coaches received the 2014 Petro-Canada Coaching Excellence Award.
