

and high school dropouts are among the highest in the prov-The arena has always functioned as a common space where youth and adults can choose to be part of an active lifestyle as well as interact with all the diverse peoples of our community. When the arena closed, the community was devastated. There are few other recreation opportunities, no pool, no gymnastics club, and this in communities without streetlights where it is dark at 4:30 in the winter.

The arena board decided they would tear the roof off the arena, and provide an outdoor ice arena for our communities. The board spent the operating budget for the next two years, in addition to gifts from municipalities and the Regional District to make this happen. The skating club earned \$3000 for the ice arena working at the music festival, and several BBQs were held. We were left at the end of summer with a roof-less arena that required

lighting and a hut for our tractor pulled zamboni tank, and a very tight bank account. Skating coach Stacey Brown, along with Val Anderson started the campaign for the Aviva Community Grant to try and earn some money for a new Zamboni, and money to operate our rink for the winter, "I never thought when I started coaching, that I would be organizing volunteers to build a zamboni hut and looking for money to get our skaters a place to skate!!!". There was a huge mobilization in the Hazleton communities, and all across Canada with family and friends and people who had heard our story voting for us every day to support the "Hard up in the Hazeltons" application. We were thrilled to make it into the finals of the Aviva competition, but had a ton of work to do to get our outdoor rink up and running . There were many work bees at the arena with contractors and community members donating their

time and skills and materials to build a hut for our Zamboni, as well as putting up hydro poles and floodlights. Volunteers of all ages were out to support the project, with even younger skaters helping to put the hockey lines on the ice.

It has been a long journey since that March day nine months ago, but Nov 24th we stepped on the ice of our outdoor arena, and on Dec 2 learned that we were successful in the Aviva Community Grant winning \$100,000. will be able to get a real Zamboni now, and will have a start on having enough money to run our arena. Getting our skaters on the ice in Hazelton has been fabulous. However, the hockey and figure skating clubs recognize that running our programs in an outdoor facility will be challenging. Already, hockey practices have started with a shovelling warm up to clear the snow from the ice, and at some skating practices the ice is too rough to spin. But we are willing to make it happen. Parents

watching their skaters take turns shovelling snow, or helping mop the lobby as the rink attendant has new duties to manage the outdoor rink.

Internationally renowned figure skating coach wows Mile 300 figure skating club

It was an amazing weekend for the Mile 300 Figure Skating Club and an opportunity of a lifetime for many of the skaters.

Jamie McGrigor national and internationally renowned figure skater, coach, and program instructor was in Fort Nelson instructing Mile 300 Figure Skating club coach, Kennedy Sha, in an intensive three day Skate Canada Primary StarSkate (PSS) course.

During his four-day stay, McGrigor also worked with skaters and local coaches in all of the club's various programs and at all levels, from Pre Canskate to Primary StarSkate.

"He has a remarkable ability to make every skater feel like a world champion," said club president Alex Swaren. "The transformation in the skaters at all levels over the weekend was incredible to witness. Within six hours of his tutelage, skaters were landing jumps and doing spins they had been working on for years. Every skater came off the ice with their head held high, laughing, and beaming with confidence."

The senior skaters were overheard jokingly conspiring and thinking of ways to keep him in Fort Nelson. "In a very short period of time he inspired and made his way into the hearts of skaters and became the club hero," Swaren said.

McGrigor worked with the skaters alongside local coaches and gave the coaches mentorship and direction. He was impressed with the Mile 300 Figure Skating Club. "If you want to learn to skate, this club is where people need to go," said McGrigor. "It's a great skating club." McGrigor also commented how lucky people are in Fort Nelson to have such an incredible recreation centre.

McGrigor has been a Skate Canada coach for 40 years. He was on the World Team twice as a competitive pairs skater alongside legends like Toller Cranston. He coached national and Olympic level skaters and coached the current coaches of Olympic skaters. He has instructed hundreds of coaches through Skate Canada's certification programs, and is the only instructor in BC who instructs the Skate Canada PSS Course.

At the end of this month he'll be in Vancouver working with skaters and their coaches who are heading to the Nationals. He is the Director of Development for BC, which includes competition preparedness for coaches and skaters at the National, International, and Olympic level.

He has taught all over Canada and has coached at one of the most prestigious and successful pairs schools in Preston, Ontario. He has worked with talents such as Lloyd Eisler & Cathy Matusik, Christine Hough & Doug Ladret, and Melinda Kunhegyi & Lydon Johnson.

He is an internationally respected ISU Technical Specialist who after March 2016 will have been on both Junior and Senior World Championship technical panels. He is heading to the World Championships in Boston in March where he will be the technical

specialist for the men's competition.

He worked at the Olympics in 2010 as a commentator.

He is also the Director of Skating at the Oak Bay Skating Club in Victoria where he coaches with his wife, Katrena.


