<p>When there is an error during the RD or FD, where is this reflected? Within the GOE or as a Choreographic Violation Deduction?</p>	<p>- Anything not permitted which is performed within a Required Element (including Choreographic Elements) is reflected in the GOE.</p> <p>- Anything not permitted that is performed outside of the Required Elements is reflected by the Choreographic Violation Deduction.</p>	<p>The full list of not permitted items in Required Elements versus Choreographic Violations can be found in the current season’s ISU Communications.</p>

PSt – Permitted Loop

Questions	Answers	Comments
<p>When performing the PSt, can the one permitted loop be performed in any direction?</p>	<p>Yes. The permitted loop may be performed in any direction and any size within the PSt pattern.</p>	<p>It is permitted to cross the long axis up to three times when performing the permitted loop during the PSt pattern</p> <p>If the couple perform more than one loop during the PSt, this is not permitted and Judges should reflect this within their GOE evaluation.</p>

Stops within Choreographic Rhythm Sequence, ChRS

Questions	Answers	Comments
Is a stop performed at the beginning and/or end of a Choreographic Rhythm Sequence permitted?	Yes. The definition of a ChRS is “barrier to barrier”.	The stops performed within the ChRS or at its beginning or end should not be considered as the two permitted stops for the entire Rhythm Dance.
